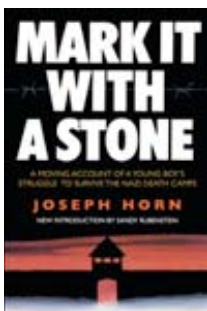

Sandy Rubenstein is the daughter of a survivor. On September 1, 1939 her father, Joseph Horn, began a nightmarish ordeal through one of the most devastating eras of human history. Surviving Auschwitz, Blizyn, and Bergen-Belsen, Horn was the only one in his family to stay alive. In this new edition, with an introduction by his daughter, we learn the impact of the devastating events, not only on the survivors but on their children as well.

As the survivors age and die, so goes the opportunity to tell their stories. Their children have a story to tell as well. What is it like to live with the knowledge of what your parents went through? And importantly, who will tell these stories now?

In the face of the genocide of ethnic groups in Bosnia, Rwanda, Darfur, and other areas of the world today, it is imperative to remind ourselves of the potential for evil. At the same time, we must teach tolerance. The message of the perils of silence and indifference, along with the message of the strength of the human spirit to endure when confronted with an atrocious reality, makes *Mark it with a Stone* a compelling and moving read.
